

MARRED, MEDIOCRE, OR MATURE MARRIAGE?

The devil is tearing up the home. In the U. S., there are 2.4 million marriages and 1.2 million divorces every year. About 40% of all first marriages end in divorce. Certain they merely chose the wrong man or woman the first time, those who divorce set out again to find Mr. or Mrs. Right. Unfortunately, "60 to 67 percent of second marriages fail, and 70 to 73 percent of third marriages."1 Clearly, the solution was not to find a better pick. Ordinarily, both husband and wife have plenty of work to do on themselves to have a successful marriage. Others, because of their commitment to God, children, and church, will likely never divorce, but the quality of these relationships is a marred reflection of the standard set by Christ and the church (Ephesians 5).

Why settle for a mediocre marriage? Halting, crippled, cold, joyless marriages handicap us in the expression of our greatest joint responsibility -- "bringing up our children in the nurture and admonition of the Lord" (Ephesians 6:4). Family counselors Gary and Marie Izzo say the greatest gift you can give to the wholesome development of your children is a loving, healthy relationship with your spouse. That should be motivation enough to work on our marriages.

The greatest marriage counseling question I have ever heard: "What percentage of your marriage difficulties can be laid upon your spouse?" I like this question because our speech and behavior tend to communicate that most – if not all! – of the

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blame should be laid upon our spouse. This question can expose the extent of my compliance to God's command in Philippians 2:3, "Let nothing be done through selfish ambition or conceit, but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than himself." It is easier to deceive ourselves here unless we pause for careful reflection. If we fail to esteem our spouse above ourselves — one of the easiest faults to fall prey to — our marriage becomes vulnerable.

So, if I were to say that Louise is responsible for 80% of the difficulties in our marriage it would be out in the open that I think I'm only 20% of the problem. That assessment would absolutely be wrong in our case. I'd say I'm accountable for about 70% of the challenges we face. There is greater shared responsibility in most marriages.

You see, it doesn't matter what my spouse does or fails to do, I must do what's right and correct what I've done wrong to uphold my obligation to God and family. When marriages are failing, it is likely that neither spouse is doing all they can and should be doing. Instead, each focuses on the failures of the other. That's a dead end road.

Don't follow the flesh; don't follow the crowd; follow Jesus; more fully reflect Christ and the church in your marriage!
